GUAJOME REGIONAL PARK

Just 8 miles from the Pacific Ocean, Guajome Regional Park and Campground is lush year-round, with woodland, chaparral, wetland and mixed grassland habits, and two ponds that attract a migratory birds and serve as home to a variety of animal species. On site are hiking trails, two day-use areas with playgrounds, a basketball court, restrooms and an open lawn - along with 33 full hook-up campsites, a caravan pavilion and a rustic cabin for those wishing to stay overnight.

RANCHO GUAJOME ADOBE

This authentic 1850s Spanish-Colonial-style adobe hacienda is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. The 28-room, 7,000-square-foot past-residence is surrounded by grounds that feature two courtyards, an arcaded veranda, and a chapel in a former small house. Popular annual events include Dia de Los Muertos and Rancho Christmas. Self-guided and docent-led tours are available year-round. The adobe is surrounded by wetland open space that is home to a variety of wildlife such as raccoons, ring-necked pheasants, white-tailed kites, least Bell's vireo and great horned owls.

MEET A RANGER

Belen Castillo, Park Ranger

Since summer 2019, Belen has worked for the Guajome parks - first as a park attendant and now as a park ranger. She loves plants, their unique characteristics and understanding the part they play in native ecosystems. She's also helped put dozens of trees in the ground to help rebuild San Diego's tree canopy.
