Join us in a serene setting for story time with a ranger! We’ll read a book about nature, and then take an educational walking tour of the park’s botanic garden – full of native species our local pollinators love.

This annual event supports Live Oak’s leash-free dog park with an ADA-friendly dogs-and-pet-parents walk, animal booths and pet supply vendors, raptor talks, training demonstrations and a doggy bag full of contests including cutest, biggest and best tail-wagging dog.

MARCH 25, 10 – 11:30 A.M. KIDS’ EDUCATION DAY

Learn what it takes to be a Junior Park Ranger with a special focus on owls – common hunters and foragers among the park’s majestic old growth oaks. Rangers will share owl taxidermy, showcase owl pellets and talk about cool owl adaptations and survival techniques.



Ideal for picnicking, strolling and sharing time with family and friends, Live Oak County Park has long been the cornerstone of Fallbrook. The 27-acre park is an oak tree grove that invites visitors to stay and relax. Park amenities include two softball fields, a soccer field, and volleyball and basketball courts.

The park also includes a playground, six reservable picnic areas and a unique amphitheater. A beautiful setting for special events such as weddings, family reunions and group activities, the park is home to woodpeckers, hawks and songbirds that swoop between the ancient oaks.




MEET A RANGER
