

Alpine Community Park: Jan. 14, 2021 Public Meeting Questions

On Thursday, Jan. 14, 2021, the County of San Diego Department of Parks and Recreation hosted a virtual public meeting on the design concept plan for Alpine Community Park. This was the fourth public meeting on the park, and the most highly attended with over 300 attendees and more than 400 questions.

Some questions were answered live and can be heard in the Q&A recording from the meeting, which is saved as a link next to this document on the sdparcs.org/publicmeetings web page. Other questions were responded to directly in the Q&A panel/chat. However, a large number of questions were not answered due to time constraints.

Below is the full list of questions asked during the presentation, with the answers that were presented live, or notes as to where the answers to those questions can be found in the Alpine Community Park FAQ document, which is saved next to this document on the sdparcs.org/publicmeetings web page. When the Alpine Little League was formed, the population was @5000, we're now over 15000 with no more playing fields. Nature play, hiking, etc may be important, but so are youth sports which seem to be totally ignored in this plan!
