MULTIPLE SPECIES CONSERVATION PROGRAM



- The Multiple Species Conservation Program (MSCP) began in 1997 to create the largest urban preserve in the country.
- The program developed in the south-east portion of the county in conjunction with wildlife agencies and other jurisdictions
- The MSCP started with a baseline of 28,000 acres and plans were in place to expand the program to the rest of the county

TRANS-COUNTY TRAIL



- After years of effort to create a county-wide plan for a network of trails, county supervisors celebrated the 110-mile Trans-County Riding and Hiking Trail connecting Torrey Pines to the Anza-Borrego Desert.
- A Trails proclamation by county supervisors was issued in April 1998 with representatives of multiple, collaborative agencies attending the event.

DPR marked its 50th anniversary in 1996 with a celebration at Heritage Park.

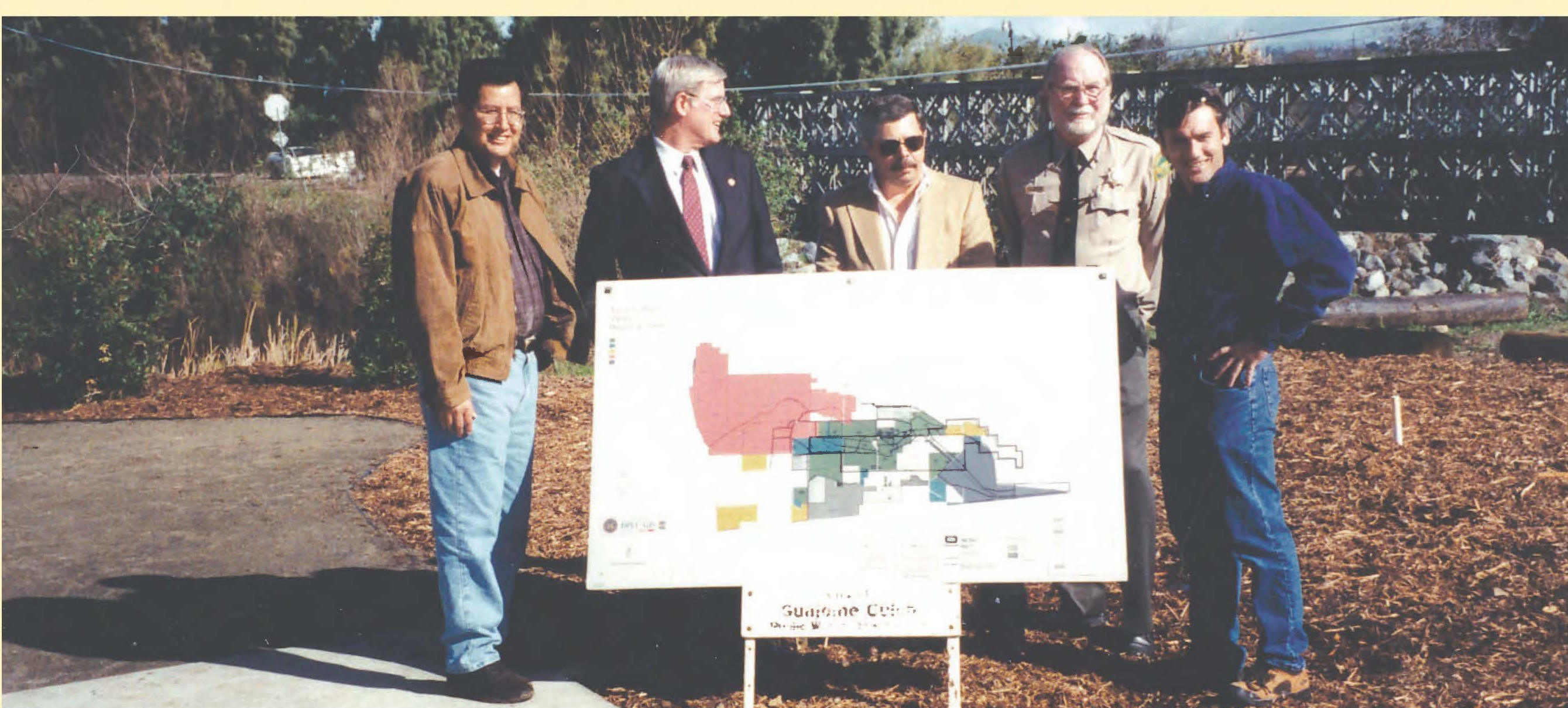

SAN ELIJO LAGOON

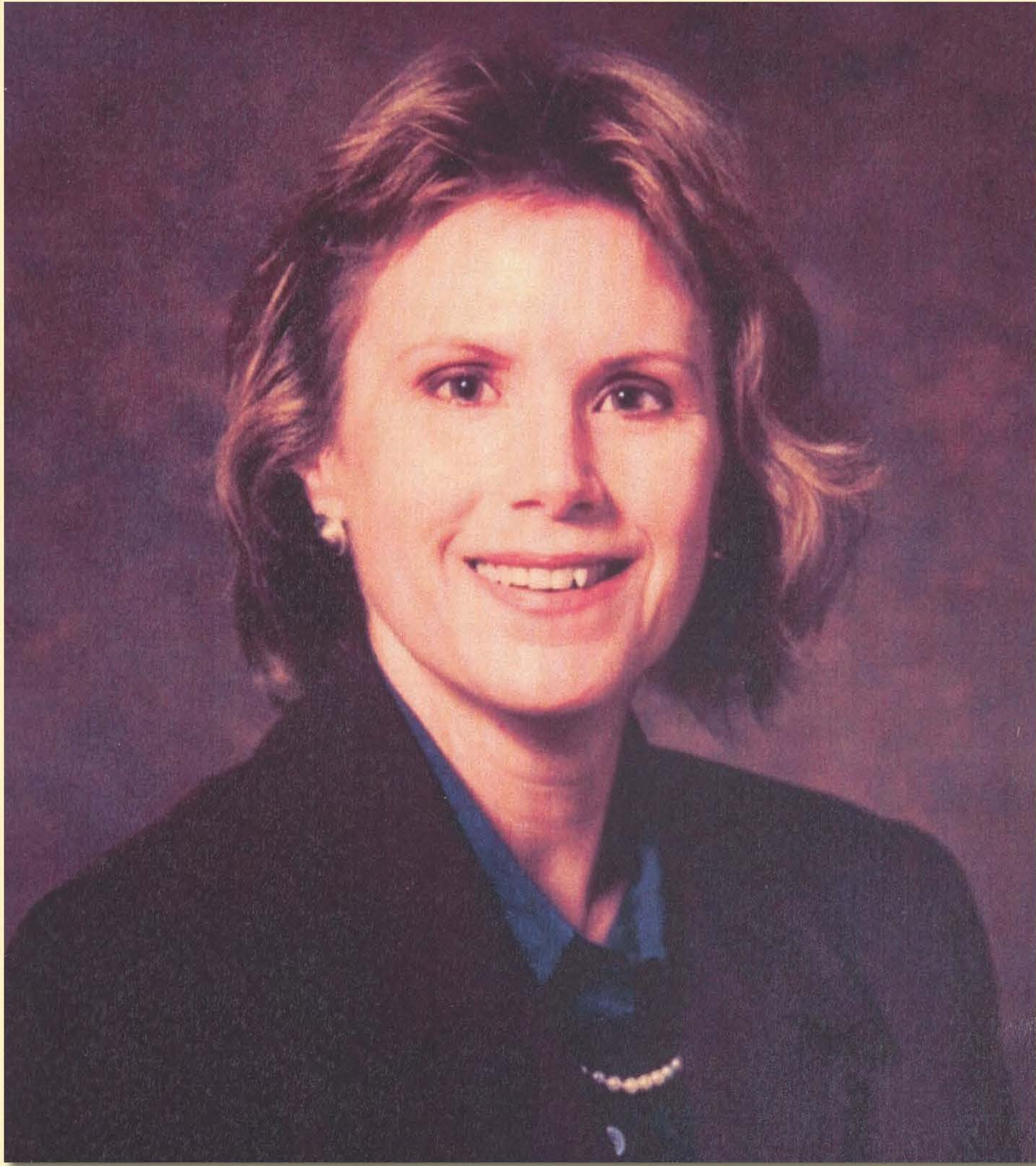
NATURE CENTER
